
Autumn 1 Reception Information and Topic overview

Responding to new rules, routines and expectations in school and developing independence in the Reception provision

Building relationships with our friends and teachers and being a member of a class group

Developing our Characteristics for Effective Learning

Talk about home experiences and being a member of their family Adapt behaviour to new events.

Join in with calming 'mindfulness' activities

Kind hands, kind feet, let's discuss, happy, sad, disappointed, hurt, upset, delighted, excited thrilled. We often say 'my turn, your turn' when we are modelling something new. Making good choices

Physical Development

Develop pencil grip and control through a range of fine motor activities in the provision

Handle and use scissors and other tools safely

Learning to move in different ways

Learning to develop healthy practices such as hand washing and remembering to drink water and healthy eating and living

Manage self independently. Learn to use cutlery, drinking from cup independently

Manage clothing change and fastenings with growing independence

Understanding the World

Getting to know the Reception and school environment.
Following a route to find library, dining hall, office, hall.
Know where we live, notice things on our way to school in our community. Features of 'my house/flat/home'
Sharing our summer experiences and family news 'My
Summer bag' show and tell/display and celebrate
Finding out about our similarities and differences and those of our families and teachers
Learning about Autumn and Harvest Time. Bake bread
Know I go to Whitley Park School and I live in Reading
Teacher/ different family names. House types-flat,
bungalow etc. Autumn, conker, celebrate, harvest. wheat,
corn, seed, combine harvester, church, charity, clattering,
threshing, recycling, litter, ingredients, plan, route

Reception Autumn Term One

Theme: "Happy, Healthy Me"

Story Focus: "The Little Red Hen"

- I have a body, a very busy body
- Head's shoulders, knees and toes
- This Old Man, he played one.
- The little Red Hen song.
- Don't drop litter, put it in the bin-classroom rules song
- We are the children of Whitley Park School-school song
- Big Red Combine Harvester
- Autumn Leaves are falling down

Communication and Language Development

Responding to 'whole body' listening cards; good sitting, listening, looking, talking, asking and responding to questions and instructions

Following simple instruction to find and retrieve things in Reception

Use and, and because and 'how' and 'why' questions

Sharing our Summer and family experiences with class, speak in full sentence

Communicate by taking turns in conversation with friends during play

Developing vocabulary, learning new words associated with my school, my family and the world around me. Join in with songs and rhymes

Listen, listening, looking, thinking, attention, concentrate, curious, partner

We ask children to 'use your words' when speaking, and to 'talk to your partner'.

Manners-please and thank you!

Literacy

Learning the letter sounds through daily Phonics sessions in following order; m, a, s, d, t, l, n, p, g, o, c, k, u, b, f, e, l, h, sh, ck, r, j. v. y. w

Learning to blend sounds orally to make c-v-c words-'Fred Talk' and joining in with games such as 'Animal Fred' and 'Fred in the house'

Begin to attempt to write green words; I, am, not, cat, pig, hen, dog by sounding out and using sound mat to help us.

Recognise 'tricky, red' words by sight; 'I', 'the', 'said'

Form recognisable letters and our names independently

Attempts to apply initial sounds when we write words, labels, lists and captions Write for purpose-birthday cards, invitations

To develop a love of books and to select new library and reading books to share To retell story of 'The Little Red Hen', to name characters and sequence of events Respond to 'who, what, where, when. When discussing stories, songs and rhymes Fred talk, red words, green words, tricky, sequence, character, who, what, where, when, list, label, caption, invitation, celebration, mill, corn, wheat, bake



Mathematics

Counting in order to 10 and beyond Recognising Numicon and using practical apparatus-5 Frame and 10's Frame.

Recognising pictorial representations on 5/10 frame, dice patterns and small quantities without having to count out-(subitising)

Counting out accurately, matching quantities, ordering and number bonds to 5

Comparing quantities, same, more and fewer Know my age, class and house number Learning about shape and simple measures

More than, less than, same, taller than, shorter than, number and shape names, add. altogether, makes, beginning, final, Before, later, soon, similar, different, share, equal, equally

Expressive Arts and Design

Explore paint, collage and construction materials Know to display my 'creations' on my own board in Gallery room. Collage/make puppet of my key group character, make class birthday cards.

Build role-play scenarios with friends and engage in imaginative play with small world resources
Join in with singing, dancing and ring games and begin to move rhythmically in response to music
Begin to draw, paint and construct with a purpose in mind.

Collage, cut, stick, imagination, think about, create, role play, small world-home corner, messages, shopping list, baking, sensory play
