ADMISSIONS TO WHITLEY PARK

Whitley Park is a popular three-form entry Primary School. The standard admission number of places per year group in school is 90. All admissions to the school are managed centrally by Brighter Futures for Children.

We also have a large onsite Nursery. Children are admitted to the nursery the term after their third birthday Please contact the school office to apply for a place directly



FUNTASTIC KIDS: After school and holiday club

As a school we are pleased to offer parents an after-school club provision from 3:15pm-6:00pm daily. We offer holiday club provision with our providers; Funtastic Kids too Please contact.bookings@funtastickids.co.uk for further information or to reserve places at either facility.

STARTING SCHOOL

To make each child's introduction to school as successful as possible, we operate a staggered start for the first two weeks, which we believe helps our reception children settle in more happily and confidently. We welcome parents/carers into the reception provision and into the nursery setting at the beginning of the session daily to help with transition.

NURSERY

The maximum number of places available in our nursery is 120. We offer 15 hours of nursery entitlement for all children and offer these hours flexibly over either mornings, afternoons or over two and a half days. We also offer 30-hour funding for eligible families. We currently offer 30-hour provision jointly with our After-School Club provider: 'Funtastic Kids'



SCHOOL RULES

We have three simple rules which capture our expectations:

CONDUCT

- ❖ We expect every child to arrive at school on time, with the correct named uniform and equipment so they are ready to learn
- No jewellery is to be worn in school and long hair should be tied back and extremes of haircut are discouraged.
- No make up to be worn
- Walk in the corridors on the left-hand side and move around the school quietly
- It is not safe for children to leave school without an adult before Year Four
- PE kit (Black shorts and white t-shirt) and school pumps are needed in school daily
- When first starting school it is essential that your child has a school reading folder which will be used every day to transport books and other information between home and school.

SCHOOL MEALS AND SNACKS

We are a cashless school and we ask that all payments for meals, trips and activities are paid for, online using Parent Pay. When your child starts with us you will receive a letter with instructions on how to set up a Parent Pay account and your child will be provided with a unique username and password. All children in the Nursery, Reception and Key Stage One have free fruit provided daily by the 'Fruit and Vegetable scheme'. They also have the option to purchase milk each day – this can be ordered online through www.coolmilk.com, where you can register your child and pay for milk. There is no charge for children under the age of 5 years or for those children who are eligible for Pupil Premium funding. Children in Key Stage 2 can bring a healthy snack to have at playtime. We encourage all children to bring a named plastic water bottle to school daily.

Children can have a school meal or a packed lunch

All children in Reception, Year 1 and Year 2 will receive a hot meal free of charge. For children in Key Stage Two, school meals should be ordered and paid for online using Parent Pay. If you are eligible to register for free school meals <u>please ensure that you do so</u> because by registering, your child will also receive additional funding to support them with their learning. Please ensure packed lunches are healthy and do not contain any more than one small treat such as some crisps or a biscuit. All options/menu choices are listed on Parent Pay. In the Summer Term a school packed lunch can also be ordered too.

If your child has special dietary needs or allergies please inform us and the school dining room We are a nut free school. Please ensure that all snacks and packed lunches do not contain nuts, sweets or fizzy drinks







ATTENDANCE

Children should arrive promptly to school each day. They will be marked as 'late' if they arrive after 9:00am. If a child arrives later than 9.15am it will count as an absence for the morning session. Children's attendance and punctuality is closely monitored by our dedicated attendance officer. Please inform us if your child cannot attend school, providing us with the reason why. Absences are followed up if attendance falls below 95% If your child is absent and we have not been given a reason, we will send you a text message for you make contact. if we do not receive a reason for a child's absence it will be recorded as unauthorised

If you have not made contact after day 3 of a child's absence, a welfare check will be made

When reporting an absence please provide your child's name, class and reason for the absence.

MEDICAL

Please inform us of any medical conditions your child has. We can only administer prescribed medication

Children who have been sick should stay home for 24 hours following the sickness. We extend this to 48 hours if there is an epidemic as we need to keep the spread of disease under control. Children who have been sick and have had diarrhoea should stay home for 48 hours.

We are responsible for gathering information on childhood illness and sometimes have to notify the health authorities. We will notify parents if we have cases of German Measles or any other notifiable disease reported to us. We will treat all the information you give to us confidentially. If you need to attend medical, speech or dental appointments with your child during school time please bring your child back to school after the appointment or make the appointment at the end of the school day.

Leave of Absence

Please note that any requests for leave of absence including family holidays during term time will not be authorised, unless there are exceptional circumstances. Any families who take the children out of school without authorisation may find that they face a fixed penalty notice. A fixed penalty notice is issued per parent per child. Any requests for leave of absence from school must be applied for in advance by completing a form that can be obtained from the school office. Parents/carers will be informed of the Head Teacher's decision within 5 days of the form being completed.



COMMUNICATION

Effective communication is central to our approach. We value parents as partners and have a range of systems in place to support all stakeholders.

These include:

- Parents Evenings, including virtual technology to support ease of attendance
- Tapestry-electronic learning journal in EYFS

We ensure families receive termly information to support their child's learning at home, including a curriculum overview, essential vocabulary list and homework.

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CURRICULUM

Learning is the core purpose of our school and is central to everything that happens.

Our curriculum integrates the requirements of the National Curriculum in a bespoke and engaging way. It is designed to equip children with the foundations for life. A strong emphasis on reading and phonics in Key Stage 1 gives children the necessary building blocks to become confident and independent learners.

We plan and teach thematic units of study which make the most of real cross curricular links. The learning is carefully sequenced and scaffolded to ensure children learn subject specific content in an ordered and progressive way.

This approach promotes opportunities for children to apply their learning with purpose and leads to high levels of engagement. We want Whitley Park pupils to be inquisitive, motivated and resilient learners who are well prepared as future citizens.



SPECIAL EDUCATIONAL NEEDS

Learning within each classroom is structured so that all children are motivated and supported to succeed. Termly assessments in all classes ensure children with specific needs are quickly identified and diagnosed.

Our qualified and experienced Inclusion Leader (Dr Lynch) is able to assess children and coordinate structured support from a team of well-trained support staff.

We work with parents and external services to deliver flexible arrangements that best suit the needs of each individual child and family.

Our strong and deliberate emphasis on oracy ensures children develop language and independence.



ENRICHMENT

Extra-curricular clubs are just one way we enhance the curriculum; these include football and other sports, choir and the chance to learn an instrument and join a band. Our 'Rocksteady' band enjoy performing to us all at the end of a term.


In addition, each termly topic is linked to a trip or visitor which is carefully selected to add to the learning experience and strengthen children's understanding and knowledge.
